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MAYOR STRAUSS: Good evening folks. Thank you for coming out tonight. We have a couple of hearings before we get into our work session. The first one is on repealing our tax law.

Mr. Scalero.

MR. SCALERO: Legal notice, public hearing

Proposed Local Law repealing Local Law No. 1 of 2021 authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law Section 3-C.

MR. GIBBONS: Back on March 10 this Board prophylactically adopted Local Law No. 1 of 2021 which was a local law amending the code to authorize property tax levy in excess of the limit established in General Municipal Law Section 3-C.

I am happy to report, based upon my discussions with the Village Treasurer, Giacomo Ciccone, that it will not be necessary to pierce the cap and, therefore, I would ask the Board to adopt the local law repealing the prior local law which would have authorized the Board to exceed the cap if it was necessary.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you. Tom Savino who handles our Community Development Funding is unavailable to make it this evening so Mr. Scalero is

going to stand in for him.

MR. SCALERO: He has submitted the following: There are three categories for funding this year. The first is a project for handicap accessible public bathrooms in the municipal building that's here at Village Hall, \$250,000.

Commercial rehabilitation for various addresses based on pending and proposed applications, \$246,000, and the residential rehabilitation Village wide 15,000.

I'll just throw some notes, the bathroom handicap accessibility is self-explanatory.

The commercial rehab is to continue our very successful downtown storefront facade rehabilitation program. I'm happy to say that you can go along Mineola Boulevard and down by Station Plaza you can see some of the projects already completed. The most recent being Spaghettini and Bruno Boulevard on the corner of Second and Mineola Boulevard. This provides signage, lights, the whole facade and more and more business owners are opting in. Tom has gotten additional funding from Community Development so that he can now boost the amounts up to 95 percent paid for by grants with the owner only having to contribute 5 percent. It is a fantastic deal, and I'm glad to say

more owners and businesses are opting into it. So would like to continue at this amount.

And the residential rehab is for home renovation. It is being tested and there are income limits but it does help people of limited means, especially seniors, stay in their homes.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Obviously we have seen the benefits of the storefront rehabilitation and we will see the benefits of the handicapped bathrooms here at the Community Center as they are certainly in dire need of revamping.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you. Mr. Ciccone, any changes in the budget?

MR. CICCONE: No.

TRUSTEE CUSATO: It's 1.9?

MAYOR STRAUSS: Yeah. Gentlemen, we have before us a budget proposed for 1.9 percent increase. As I mentioned last week, I'm greatly in debt to the department heads as well as to all of you gentlemen to make sure we keep this budget as low as possible for our are residents an business owners. These are some difficult times and Mr. Ciccone and his team worked magic and, also, the funding that we're getting from

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the federal government is certainly beneficial to us in keeping these numbers down.

Any comments from the Board, Deputy Mayor? DEPUTY MAYOR PEREIRA: Mayor, I think I said, I believe, everything I had to say last week. handed, in comments a couple of months ago. contemplating the much higher numbers and as was expected, but we did manage to, along with help from the federal government but, also, from our department heads to, once again, bring in a responsible budget under the tax cap and still being able to provide the same level of services that our residents have come to So I am happy with the budget, and I am prepared to approve it.

MAYOR STRAUSS: You're absolutely correct, Deputy Mayor, thank you.

Trustee Cusato.

TRUSTEE CUSATO: Mayor, you know I want to thank Mr. Ciccone and the other department heads for acting appropriately and keeping our numbers down while providing a great service to our Village.

> MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.

Trustee Durham?

TRUSTEE DURHAM: Thank you. I do want to thank them for the job that they did, but I do have a

question for Mr. Ciccone, if you can come up, please.

My question is not this year's budget but towards next
year's budget. With this past year we did not spend
the million dollars on the roadways, and we used that
money plus the million dollars that we got from the
federal government to cover the budget. If we have
shortfalls, I understand that the federal government is
approximately \$110 a resident, so the sum that the
Village would get which would be close to \$2 million.

If we come up with a shortfall again, we have that sum
to fall on but what are our plans for the future if we
are not going to get the revenue that we expect?

MR. CICCONE: We're hoping that the revenue, you know, in some of the lines like justice court, meters and stuff to bounce back a little bit, and then we're hoping in the future that the Harrison Garage goes on line, and we'll get some revenue from there. That's what we're hoping for.

MAYOR STRAUSS: We're expected to -- we're expecting to get back to normalcy probably by the end of the summer, if not before that, so the revenue should be continuing to increase. It's something that we're not able to budget on. We can only budget on what we've had.

TRUSTEE DURHAM: Yes, I understand that, and I

know that we reduced several lines, but do you think that going into next year we're going to have the same issue or are we going to be close?

MR. CICCONE: I'm hoping not. I think we'll be okay.

TRUSTEE DURHAM: So you think we will be okay, that is my main concern for -- I understand we got through this year, but budgets are all about the future too. So --

MR. CICCONE: Right.

TRUSTEE DURHAM: -- just making sure that we're making the right move.

MR. CICCONE: Yes.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you. Anything else, Trustee Durham?

TRUSTEE DURHAM: That's it.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Walsh?

TRUSTEE WALSH: Yes, thank you mayor. I'm prepared to vote on this tonight. Thank you, Giacomo for all of the work you did, and nobody has a crystal ball; we can't predict what's gonna happen next year, but, like you said, the garage coming on line is gonna help. Hopefully, the COVID problem won't come back, so the summonses that were not issued for about five months will be issued, and the Building Department that

was unable to give out permits for five months will be able to give out permits, so things, like the Mayor said, will come back to normal, and, you know, we're very fortunate to be able to offer 1.9 percent, and the federal government certainly did help, but that's their job also to help. And, you know, I just -- I see a bright future for the Village.

That's all, thank you.
