MAYOR STRAUSS: Evening, ladies and gentlemen. We have a Local Law that we'd like to amend. That's going to be the hearing for this evening.

So, Mr. Scalero, before you sit down, take care of this for us.

MR. SCALERO: "Legal Notice, Public Hearing, Incorporated Village of Mineola.

"Please take Notice that the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Mineola will hold a Public Hearing on Wednesday, October 11, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. at the Village Hall, 155 Washington Avenue, Mineola, New York 11501, or at some other location to be hereafter designated by the Board of Trustees, in order to receive public comment upon the following:

"Proposed Local Law amending Section 198 of the Municipal Code of the Incorporated Village of Mineola, entitled 'Architectural and Site Plan Review', Section 198-3, entitled 'Powers and Jurisdiction of Planning Board'.

"The Village of Mineola does not discriminate on the basis of handicapped status in administration or

access to or employment in its projects and activities.

Joseph R. Scalero has been directed to coordinate

compliance with non-discrimination requirements of the

Federal Revenue Sharing regulations.

"At this scheduled meeting of its Board of

Trustees reserved decisions from previous meetings, if

any, may be acted upon by the Board of Trustees.

"At the aforesaid time and place all interested persons will be given an opportunity to be heard.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you Mr. Scalero.

Gentlemen, as you know, we've continually gone through the code looking for ways to streamline the process for our residents. Some of the processes are a little cumbersome. Some need to be. Some don't need to be.

So what we're doing is going through those right now and we're trying to eliminate some of the awkwardness and the burden that is placed on the residents when they want to do certain things.

So with that being said, I'm going to pass this over to Mr. Gibbons, who is going to go through what this

is.

MR. GIBBONS: Thank you, Mayor.

As you stated, the Building Department has been looking for ways to streamline the process to make it easier for the residents, more time efficient and less expensive.

In that regard the Architectural Review Board in Mineola, which is performed on the Planning Board, has jurisdiction over all applications for alterations and additions, and this includes one-family and two-family homes.

The Building Department has found over the years that individual homeowners coming to the Building Department for simple additions -- such as porticoes, porches and vestibules -- to comply with the Village Law are still required to file applications and pay fees and appear in front of the Planning Board for architectural review. The Building Department has recommended that those de minimis items -- specifically porticoes, porches and vestibules -- be exempt from review for the Planning Board.

As I said, the Building Department would continue to review the applications to ensure compliance with the zoning law. If they did need some type of variance -- like a front yard setback variance -- they

1	would still be required to go to the Zoning Board. But
2	this will allow those additions to proceed more quickly,
3	the homeowners to get their permits and to do those small
4	additions.
