19	Mr. Whalen, report on mailings?
20	MR. WHALEN: Yes, Mr. Mayor.
21	We have the Affidavit of Mailing. It's been
22	notarized and signed, and everything is in order.
23	MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. Thank you very
24	much.
25	Mr. Gibbons, anything?

1	MR. GIBBONS: Yes.
2	Nassau County Planning Commission has
3	recommended local determination, and I would ask for a
4	resolution declaring this a Type II Action under SEQRA.
5	MAYOR STRAUSS: Would someone like to make a
6	motion?
7	MR. WALSH: Motion.
8	MR. PEREIRA: Second.
9	MAYOR STRAUSS: Motion by Trustee Walsh.
10	Seconded by Trustee Pereira.

20	for this evening's hearing: The applicant will make its
21	presentation and call any witnesses it has. When they're
22	done with their presentation the Board will ask any
23	questions that we have and then, at that time, we'll open
24	it up to public comment.
25	I ask anyone who is approaching the podium to

please speak clearly, speak slowly, for the benefit of our reporter, and state your name and your address for the record.

So who is here for 393?

Ma'am, come on up. Welcome.

MS. RUSSO: Thank you.

Good evening. My name is Patricia Russo. I reside at 21 Crest Hollow Lane in Albertson, New York.

Thank you for your time this evening and for allowing me to speak to you today.

I'm requesting a Special Use Permit for a business that I would like to open, a Sylvan Learning center, at 393 Jericho Turnpike. The business would operate primarily Monday through Thursday from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and Saturday mornings from 9:00 to 12:00. It's a tutoring center where children are primarily dropped off by their parents, mostly for a one- to two-hour session.

Most parents will drop off, visit local stores and businesses, and then come back and pick up the students. The business location has ample parking in the rear of the building and a municipal lot across the street. There would usually be three to five employees for about ten to 15 children, depending on how busy the day is. There are no food or snacks offered to the

1	children. So there's no additional waste which would be
2	produced.
3	I kindly request your consideration and
4	approval. Again, thank you for your time.
5	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you. Appreciate your
6	choosing Mineola.
7	Have you done this type of work before?
8	MS. RUSSO: I actually
9	MAYOR STRAUSS: Previous business?
10	MS. RUSSO: Yes, I do. I have a franchise in
11	Huntington which has been in business for about 14 years.
12	I took it over about a year ago. My primary business was
13	banking prior to this. But the tutoring service has been
14	doing very well and I was lucky enough to be able to
15	secure a franchise here in the territory closer to my
16	home and in Mineola. So I was looking forward to opening
17	here.
18	MAYOR STRAUSS: Great. Thank you.
19	Deputy Mayor?
20	MR. PEREIRA: Thank you.
21	Good evening. Thank you for coming out.
22	There was a Sylvan center on Old Country Road
23	in Garden City, wasn't there one?
24	MS. RUSSO: Yes, there was.
25	MR. PEREIRA: So that one is closing and this

1	one is replacing that one?
2	MS. RUSSO: That's been out of business or I
3	don't know exactly what happened to it. I don't know if
4	the person
5	MR. PEREIRA: But it's not there anymore.
6	MS. RUSSO: It hasn't been there for a while.
7	MR. PEREIRA: OK. Will this also be a testing
8	center?
9	I know that some of these places will double as
10	a place where students can take tests, or if somebody's
11	taking the MCATs or GMAT, something like that. Will that
12	be going on?
13	MS. RUSSO: There will be proctoring there for
14	real estate tests. We don't do MCATs or LSATs or
15	anything like that. A lot of it is real estate testing,
16	some regents. Some students who are taking online
17	courses, like, during the breaks, if they go to Buffalo
18	or somewhere out of state, they'll be able to take the
19	test at our center.
20	MR. PEREIRA: OK. And those will be within
21	those hours as well
22	MS. RUSSO: That's correct.
23	MR. PEREIRA: Give or take.
24	How about in the summer? Will the hours change
25	in the summer? Will you have summer camp, like a

learning camp kind of thing to, you know, kind of the 1 summer slide, as they call it --2 MS. RUSSO: Right. 3 MR. PEREIRA: -- and prevent that. 4 MS. RUSSO: We do offer camps. Usually they're 5 robotic camps, and they're usually held maybe once or 6 twice a week. We do continue to do tutoring, believe it 7 or not. So that's our core business and it actually 8 stays pretty strong through the summer. 9 MR. PEREIRA: OK. So you do, like, robotics 10 camp; is that what you said? 11 MS. RUSSO: Yes. Robotics. 12 MR. PEREIRA: Robotics and --13 14 MS. RUSSO: Coding. MR. PEREIRA: -- coding. 15 MS. RUSSO: Mm hmm. 16 MR. PEREIRA: That type of thing. 17 Parties. Will you have birthday parties, or 18 any -- not that I would think a lot of kids would want to 19 sign up for a tutoring party, but . . . 20 MS. RUSSO: We have tried it in the past in my 21 Huntington location and it didn't -- it was really more 22 trouble than it was worth, as far as the party was 23 concerned. So we stick really to the main core business 24

of tutoring and the robotics. It gives kids a little bit

1	of a reprieve, especially the kids who are looking for
2	more of an enhancement. So they'll do the robotics and
3	the coding. And then the rest of the kids, they try and
4	keep up with their studies so they're not behind when
5	September rolls around.
6	MR. PEREIRA: Excellent. I certainly see this,
7	obviously, as a low-impact use in that building. And as
8	you said, there is ample parking. You have a great
9	location. So I certainly don't see any problem.
10	Good luck to you if you get approved.
11	MS. RUSSO: Thank you.
12	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
13	MS. RUSSO: Thank you.
14	MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Cusato?
15	MR. CUSATO: Thank you.
16	Good evening, ma'am.
17	I don't have an issue. I have some questions.
18	Ms. RUSSO: Sure.
19	MR. CUSATO: Are you located 393 is a
20	two-story building. There's like ten, 11, 12 offices in
21	that building.
22	MS. RUSSO: Yes.
23	MR. CUSATO: Are you on the first floor, second
24	floor?
25	MS. RUSSO: I'm on the first floor, on the

1	corner of Jericho and Latham.
2	MR. CUSATO: OK. So you'll use the main
3	entrance to get into your place? Because there are
4	entrances all over the building.
5	MS. RUSSO: Yes. There's an entrance on the
6	side, on Latham. So that would be the entrance that goes
7	into the center that I would be occupying.
8	MR. CUSATO: Well that's great. So people
9	could stop by and drop the kids off on Latham, right?
LO	MS. RUSSO: Correct.
L1	MR. CUSATO: OK. Now I notice there's a
L2	learning center already in that building, or is that sign
13	an old sign? There's a on the west side of the
14	building, on Latham, there's a Sovarian Learning Center,
15	(phonetic).
L6	Are they gone, or are they there as well?
L7	MS. RUSSO: That's actually my window sign.
18	MR. CUSATO: Oh. So that's already your sign.
19	MS. RUSSO: Yes.
20	MR. CUSATO: OK. All right. Thank you.
21	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
22	Trustee Durham?
23	MR. DURHAM: I have no questions.
24	And should you get approved, welcome to
25	Mineola.

1	MS. RUSSO: Thank you.
2	MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Walsh?
3	MR. WALSH: Yes, Mayor. Thank you.
4	Hello, Ms. Russo. How are you today?
5	MS. RUSSO: Good.
6	How are you?

9	franchisor for this? Who is the

17	which is the corporation, so Sylvan corporate, and I'm
18	the franchisee of that corporation.
19	MR. WALSH: OK. Thank you.
20	And you know, I know that building quite well.
21	I worked in that building when I was in Mineola High
22	School. And there's plenty of parking. It used to be a
23	factory. Now it has many uses.
24	I have no further questions. Thank you.
25	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.

1	Anything else you'd like to mention?
2	MS. RUSSO: No. I think that's it.
3	MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. Great. I'm going
4	to open it up to public comment. Don't go far.
5	MS. RUSSO: OK. I can sit back down?
6	MAYOR STRAUSS: Yes, but don't go far.
7	MS. RUSSO: OK. Thank you.
8	MAYOR STRAUSS: Not that we have a big room
9	here, but probably sit in the front row there because

24 25 Mineola. Vince Minutella's manager. He apologizes for not being here. He's quite ill, and this was meant to be a bit of a placeholder set at the last meeting. So he asked if I would come in and speak with you quickly.

With regard to the resolution, I've spoken with Sean Sally, Supervisor, Nassau County Planning

Department. He indicated that their concern with the resolution was directed towards Mineola's concerns. So we have to direct our response to the Village. The Village then has to tell them: OK. We're good with it. Then they issue a countermanding resolution.

With regard to the response, we have taken the Board's, our neighbors' and the County's concerns to heart. We are in the process of formulating the best way to deal with all those issues. We're working with our contractor, our architect, as well as we've also engaged a landscape design architect to help with the seating concerns that you had, and also the noise suppression and control.

With that, we will be settling a few things and submitting a response to the Village, hopefully very soon, and I assume we'll address any further concerns at the next meeting and then go from there, if that is all right with the Board.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Absolutely.

1	MR. GIBBONS: If you are going to make a
2	submission, if you can not wait till the hearing night to
3	do it.
4	MR. MILLER: No. No. Absolutely not.
5	We came here not prepared with the answer and
6	I'm not going to try and go over that with you.
7	MR. GIBBONS: All right.
8	So if you'd make that submission to the
9	Building Department, the Building Department will then
10	give it to me. I will transmit it to the Nassau County
11	Planning Commission. And that way I'll be able to track
12	when the second resolution on the application comes out.
13	MR. MILLER: Excellent. Thank you.
14	MAYOR STRAUSS: Anything else, sir?
15	MR. MILLER: That should do it for tonight.
16	MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. Great.
17	So I understand I see that there are several
18	residents here from the neighborhood.
19	Is there anyone wishing to speak again that
20	hasn't spoken at the previous meeting that would like to
21	weigh in and give their opinions and voice their
22	concerns, or support, or whatever their issues are, on
23	the record?
24	MR. HALE: We've already spoken.

MR. CUSATO: Good evening, sir. 1 I'm concerned about the compressors that you're 2 going to add. Are they loud? Noisy? What kind of 3 compressors are they? 4 MR. MILLER: Well, again --5 MR. CUSATO: Because they're facing the north 6 7 side, towards the residential area. MR. MILLER: That's correct, and there was 8 something that was voiced the last time. 9 MR. CUSATO: Yes. 10 MR. MILLER: Again, I would like to have our 11 contractor here at the next meeting to discuss with you 12 the specific compressors that we plan on using and what 13 level of noise they might project and, in addition to 14 that, how we intend to rectify it. 15 MR. CUSATO: Fine. Thank you very much. 16 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. Great. So we'll look to 17 adjourn this again and continue it on February 14th. 18 So, folks, anybody that's interested in voicing 19 their opinions, or just hearing about what's going to 20 happen, feel free to come down here on February 14th. 21 MR. MAYOR STRAUSS: Ladies and gentlemen, we are 1 going to reopen the hearing for 52 Jericho Turnpike. 2 There were several questions and concerns that the Board 3 had, and we will open that up and continue. 5 "Application of Meixia Huang for a Special Use 6 Permit pursuant to Chapter 550 of the Code of the 7 Incorporated Village of Mineola, entitled 'Zoning', 8 Section 550.12, entitled 'B-1 Districts', Subsection (B), 9 10 entitled 'Special Uses', to install new cooking equipment, cooling and warming buffet tables, restaurant 1.1 grills and fryers, and seating for 72 people with 17 12 dining tables at existing supermarket upon the property 13 known as 52 Jericho Turnpike, Mineola, New York, known 14 15 and designated on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as 16 Section 9, Block 662, lots 13, 15 and 16." 17 MR. QIU: Good evening. My name is Jersey Qiu, 18 28 Merit Lane, Jericho. 19 MAYOR STRAUSS: Mr. Qiu, you said? 20 21 MR. QIU: Mr. Qiu. We're here for last time we mention about the 22 I believe Trustee Cusato mentioned about 23 drawing. drawing, we'd made several mistakes on the drawing. 24 25 Today we have our architect, Ms. Meixia Huang. Maybe she

can explain the whole thing better. 1 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. Whoever you need to bring 2. up to the podium, please do so. 3 MR. QIU: I'm sorry? 4 MR. PEREIRA: She should come up. 5 MAYOR STRAUSS: Yes. She should come up to the 6 7 podium. MS. HUANG: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. 8 My name Meixia Huang. My address is 33-06 9 162nd Street, Flushing. 10 Basically we revise the quality and match the 11 number fixtures and match the plan right now. So if you 12 have any questions you can ask me right now about the 13 plan. 14 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. So I quess we'll -- Mr. 15 Cusato, you had the most questions. 16 MR. CUSATO: I did. You know what -- again, I 17 want to say: I have no problem with your concept. I did 18 have a problem with your drawing, as you know. 19 So I did review your drawing, and thank you for 20 making the changes, but I notice that you made other 21 changes. You added things, you deleted things, and you 22 removed things. And my question is: If we were to have 23 approved this back at the December 13th meeting, would 24

you have made the same changes now that you didn't make

before? 1 Do you know what I'm saying? 2 MS. HUANG: I understand. 3 Basically, for my point, we just submit the 4 paperwork. DOB didn't review the plan yet. DOB, 5 Building Department, didn't review the plan yet. 6 thought we're going to receive, like, objections from you 7 guys. That's what I thought. 8 MAYOR STRAUSS: So there was a miscommunication 9 between what you expected and what our Building 10 Department expected. 11. MS. HUANG: Yes --12 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. So now --13 MS. HUANG: So normally --14 MAYOR STRAUSS: I apologize for interrupting 15 16 you. Just so I understand it: You submitted plans 17 to the Building Department for review and you expected 18 them to return them to you with changes. 19 MS. HUANG: Yes. I thought that's the 20 procedure. 21 So let me just point out, MR. CUSATO: OK. 22 just as information, you moved things around and there's 23 no dishwashers on your drawing. I know you have to have 24 them, but I didn't see them on your drawing. And I'm not 25

1	holding that against you but, again, when the Building
2	Department looks at the plans just make sure you show
3	where the dishwashers are going to be.
4	MR. QIU: I'm sorry. As I mentioned last time,
5	there was a mistake. We never have a dishwashing
6	machine.
7	MR. CUSATO: I understand that. So I'm just
8	asking you, just when you present your drawings to the
9	Building Department, show where because right now the
L O	revised drawings don't show where you have any
11	dishwashers, and I know that's not true. I know you're
L2	going to have them.
13	MR. QIU: We're not going to have them.
L4	MR. CUSATO: OK.
L5	MR. QIU: Thank you.
L6	MR. WALSH: Did you just say you're not going
L 7	to have any?
L8	MR. QIU: We're not going to have dish washing
L9	because it's more like fast food. We take everything as
20	one time fast food service type of thing. You know,
21	people eat and put in the garbage. We don't have any
22	dishes. It's not like a formal dining restaurant.
23	MAYOR STRAUSS: So anything you have to wash
24	would be done in a sink.
25	MR. QIU: Nothing. Well, besides the

equipment, of course. 1 MR. CUSATO: I'm sorry. So. . . 2 MR. QIU: Not dishes. We're not having a dish 3 washing machine because we don't have dishes to wash, but 4 we just have equipment to wash in the three compartment 5 sink. 6 And Trustee Cusato mentioned we made changes. 7 We don't really make a lot of changes besides just adding 8 a soda machine. Actually, it's a fountain soda. Last 9 time you guys mentioned about are we having, like, 10 serving sodas. We're not serving bottled sodas, you 11 know, that would be a conflict for the supermarket 12 because we are paying the supermarket. We do have the 13 fountain water machine. I mean the soda machine. 14 that's the only thing we added to the drawing. 15 MR. CUSATO: And I did notice that. Thank you. 16 I did notice that. 17 And can you just explain to me this curtain 18 that you're going to use to separate? What is that 19 I'm still confused. curtain? 20 MR. QIU: Again, that's another 21 misunderstanding. It's actually the ceiling drop down 22 curtain. It existed already. It's from the ceiling. 23 MAYOR STRAUSS: It's not really a curtain. 24 MR. QIU: It's not a curtain. 25

1	MAYOR STRAUSS: If a knee wall is from the
2	ground, this is a wall from the ceiling
3	MR. QIU: Yes.
4	MAYOR STRAUSS: just a couple of feet down
5	from the top of the ceiling.
6	MR. QIU: It's a six feet wall extending from
7	the top of the room. It's not coming up from the ground.
8	MAYOR STRAUSS: And it's not an actual curtain.
9	It's called a ceiling drop
10	MR. QIU: We might be using the wrong term, but
11	it's a misunderstanding. It's not a curtain.
12	MR. CUSATO: OK. And again, please, I have no
13	problem with your concept. I just had some problems with
14	your drawings. OK?
15	MR. QIU: Understandable. Thank you so much.
16	MR. CUSATO: So thank you.
17	MR. DURHAM: I just want to ask, basically the
18	wall that had the deli sign and stuff when it was the
19	supermarket, that's the wall that we're talking about,
20	the curtain.
21	MR. QIU: Yes. The wall already there.
22	MR. DURHAM: And then you had mentioned, on the
23	seating, that you would take and drop down the number of
24	seats, this number of seats. Did you take and do that?
25	MR. QIU: Yes.

MR. DURHAM: Because I still see, I think, the same number of tables in the drawing.

MR. QIU: Yes. We don't want to have seats next to the supermarket refrigerators that deal with fish and all that stuff. That's why we just take some seats out.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Any other questions from you?

MR. DURHAM: No.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Cusato, anything?
MR. CUSATO: I'm fine. Thank you.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Mr. Pereira?

MR. PEREIRA: No. I'm fine.

I think you have the space there. It's in a good location. So I think the concern here wasn't necessarily the use. I think the use is appropriate in that location. I think the concern was the presentation the last time, but a lot of these questions will be answered between you and the Building Department. You know. There are going to be issues with signage and lighting and things like that that you're going to have to address with the Building Department, the Fire Marshal, the Department of Health. And so our concern really is the use. And of course we want to make sure that everything is accurate so that what ends up there, if we approve it, is what you presented to us. So that

was our concern. 1 But I do have one question, since the owner of 2 the FL Market is here. Will there be any additional sign 3 on the existing sign on Jericho Turnpike --4 MR. QIU: No. 5 MR. PEREIRA: -- indicating the restaurant or 6 anything like that? 7 MAYOR STRAUSS: Sir, if you could come up to 8 the podium. Just state your name and your address. 9 MR. ZHANG: Weilin Zhang, 52 Jericho Turnpike. 10 We have an awning on Jericho Turnpike. 11 still have two sections on the bottom. We might just put 12 a small section over there. 13 MR. PEREIRA: Fine. I have no problem with 14 I think that the owner of the restaurant would that. 15 actually probably enjoy the advertising. I just want to 16 make sure, again, anything to do with signs that you go 17 through the Building Department first. 18 MR. ZHANG: Of course. 19 MR. PEREIRA: And make sure that it's approved 20 and that it's up to code. 21 MR. ZHANG: Of course. Of course. 22 MAYOR STRAUSS: It's very important that you 23 follow our code. 24 MR. ZHANG: Of course. 25

MAYOR STRAUSS: Mr. Walsh, anything? 1 2 MR. WALSH: Yes. You know, what I want to say is that, like the 3 Deputy Mayor just said, our function here is land use. 4 And there is no problem with the land use for me, as far 5 as I'm concerned, with this project. The garbage is 6 going to be disposed of through the restaurant that was 7 already approved to dispose of their garbage properly. 8 There's plenty of parking. It's not interfering with 9 anyone's neighborhood. Anything that has to do with food 10 preparation, the temperature of food and such, the 11 experts at the Health Department take care of that. 12 Anything that has to do with exhaust from the building or 13 anything like, the experts, the fire marshals, take care 14 of that. Our function here is land use, and I think this 15 is a proper land use. 16 Thank you, Mayor. 17 MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you. 18 Any other questions from the Board? 19

Great. Gentlemen, I'll open it up to public comment and we'll see if anybody has anything to say. You can just have a seat.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.

Again, this is going to be the format for this evening's hearing. Actually, it's really kind of easy. So we're just going to go through it.

This is a Local Law being suggested by our Village Attorney that we create an Assessment Review Board, Board of Assessment Review. Previously we had it incorporated with our assessors, and it's better suited for the residents, as well as the Village, that we separate it. That's what we're looking to do tonight, is create a Local Law which creates a Board of Assessment to review our assessments.

Mr. Gibbons, I'll throw it to you.

MR. GIBBONS: I think that was well said, Mayor.

It's going to be a board composed of three individuals who are not employees or officers of the Village. They will be available each year on the third Tuesday of February, which by statute is grievance night, where if you disagree with the Village Assessor's

assessment of your home you can come and make a presentation, submit evidence and ask that the assessment be changed. The Board of Assessment Review will make that determination. If you're still not happy with the Board's decision, of course, there is a small claims procedure over at Nassau Supreme.

So it's one layer that the residents can avail themselves of where they can come to the Village Hall.

It's informal. They don't have to worry about retaining an attorney or anything. Come in and just make their case as to why the assessment -- the argument is usually -- should be lower, and to present any evidence that they would like.

MAYOR STRAUSS: So it's very informal, as the attorney said. It allows Village residents, as the attorney said, to come down and grieve your taxes. And I actually encourage you to do so. If you think you're over-assessed, I encourage you to come down and grieve your taxes and avail yourself of that opportunity.

So I'll open it to up any comments from the Board. Deputy Mayor?

MR. PEREIRA: Yes. Thank you.

Essentially, so that people understand, this is nothing new. People have been grieving their taxes and we've been having this grievance night forever. All that

this does is it changes the form. Rather than grieving to the three assessors that we've had in the Village, now you're grieving to a Board of Assessment Review that is separate from the assessors.

It just makes sense. It just protects the It gives the residents the comfort of knowing Village. that they are being heard by an impartial party. And it's, again, one of those things. From time to time we look at our code, or something comes up, and we realize that perhaps it's time to make a change. So this is really a relatively small administrative change in that it just changes the forum, but it doesn't change any of the mechanics in terms of grieving your taxes or the ability to grieve your taxes. As the Mayor indicated, everyone can do that, and we encourage people to do that, not only at the Village level but certainly the county, the school, and all that, because this gives them the comfort of knowing that they are being heard by an independent and separate board of review, rather than the very people that were assessing their property. just makes sense.
