21	I ask anyone approaching the podium to speak to
22	speak slowly, clearly and state your name and your
23	address so it can be accurately recorded.
24	Who is up? 44A Jericho Turnpike?
25	MR. VACHET: Yes.

1	MAYOR STRAUSS: Come on up, sir.
2	MR. VACHET: I have a quick little
3	MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. Give it to the
4	Clerk.
5	Thank you. Good evening.
6	MR. VACHET: Hey, guys. What's going on? How
7	are you?
8	First, thank you for your time today. My name
9	is Marcel. I've been a resident of Mineola my entire
10	life.
11	MR. PEREIRA: Right.
12	MR. VACHET: Yes, I remember you.
13	So I do Brazilian jiu-jitsu and this is
14	nerve-wracking, by the way. I've done a lot of
15	tournaments. This is probably the most nervous I've ever
16	been.
17	So I do Brazilian jiu-jitsu and we do personal
18	training, fitness as well. Brazil jiu-jitsu is let me
19	break it down. It's kind of like wrestling and judo.
20	It's a gentle art. We teach self-defense to kids of all
21	ages, five to 13, adults of all walks of life, lawyers,
22	doctors, nurses, police officers, detectives, fire
23	department. Everybody is in there. And I wanted to move
24	to Mineola. I've wanted that specific building for over
25	five years.

I started the gym after leaving a huge corporate gym. We actually started with ten students in a one-car garage. We moved on to Williston Park, which I had to go through a town hearing as well. And now, I told my students about five years ago that that building was going to be mine. And we go there on a daily basis. And I kid you not, and I'm like: That's going to be mine. And I know there was a bridal shop there. And for some type of reason it was supposed to be a liquor store, and that didn't happen. And I was like, Yes, it's mine. And I'm here today trying to let you guys know what I want to bring into our town.

MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. Marcel, what was your last name?

MR. VACHET: Vachet.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Vachet?

MR. VACHET: Yes.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.

How long have you been doing this?

MR. VACHET: I started martial arts when I was five years old, and I've been doing Brazilian jiu-jitsu I believe it's 12 years now. 12 years now I've been doing Muay Thai as well, which is a type of Thailand-style kickboxing. And I hold a black belt in karate. I'm also one of the few in Nassau County that is IBJJF registered,

1	which that means I have to go through an extensive
2	background search by the government. I have to have an
3	IB and C drive certified, and then all my guys have to go
4	through a background check, whoever steps in my facility
5	as in instructor, as a coach, and they background checked
6	my professor. So there's, like, five in the Nassau
7	County area, which is Floral Park, one in Glen Cove, East
8	Meadow, and then myself. And I think there's one more.
9	And I can't recall off the top of my head. And so I want
10	to bring one here.
11	MAYOR STRAUSS: Great. Thank you. Thanks for
12	looking to stay here. Appreciate it.
13	MR. VACHET: My pleasure.
14	MAYOR STRAUSS: And bringing business into the

MAYOR STRAUSS: And bringing business into the business community. It's greatly appreciated.

How long have you been teaching Brazilian jiu-jitsu, or any martial arts?

MR. VACHET: Since 2005 I started teaching. I started training right out of high school, and then my professor gave me the opportunity to teach, and I've been doing it every single day.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Great.

What are your planned hours of operation?

MR. VACHET: So we have mornings. We start off at 6:00 a.m. and then we have until 8:30, 9:00 o'clock,

when I usually kick the guys out because some of them usually are late for work. And then throughout the day it's just completely empty. And then my most packed starts at 5:00 o'clock with the kids, and we close by 9:00 o'clock. And then we do it again. Up at 5:00 a.m. --

MAYOR STRAUSS: Is that seven days a week, six days?

MR. VACHET: No. No. No.

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MAYOR STRAUSS: Saturday?

MR. VACHET: No, Saturday we're only open for two hours, which is 9:00 to 11:00, and then Sunday for one hour. That's about it. But I want to add more classes, and then -- well, our goal for this facility is to target a demographic of people that are very terrified to go into a gym seeing what we do. It's very scary to see men throwing each other around. Sweaty dudes running around.

What I created, we put together this really good idea where -- like, for example, if my mom walked in, she doesn't want to get punched in the face. She just wants to go hit the pad, have fun, right? My sister, she wants to come in, learn how to punch and defend herself, but she doesn't want to get hit. So we created, like, a hybrid-style kickboxing fitness gym.

That's why we wanted this facility, because where I'm at now I don't have the space or capability of putting it in.

So we have actually built this program and, you know, it was actually a huge hit. We had a self-defense seminar. One of my sister's friends was actually murdered this year in college. So we held a seminar for them. And then after I was like, OK. How about I test my idea on these girls now and see how they like it. And they just loved it. You know, it's high intensity. It's kind of like -- I love kickboxing, so I don't want to use their name, but it's completely different.

MAYOR STRAUSS: So this is not only self-defense teaching, it's also exercise, it's -- MR. VACHET: Yup.

MAYOR STRAUSS: It's discipline. All of those things.

MR. VACHET: It builds confidence. You meet a lot of friends. I have people that come in there like super depressed, like not in the best mental state, and we just hang out. You know, we beat each other up. We go to eat. Especially the Portuguese restaurant is, like, my favorite place to go. You know. Yeah.

MAYOR STRAUSS: It sounds like a Board meeting. We beat each other up and go eat.

MR. VACHET: Exactly. That's how we bond, you know. That's how you make friends.

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MAYOR STRAUSS: Or maybe we get beaten up.

All right. How many students are you going to have in your class? Is it -- what's your goal of how many students? I mean, five, ten?

MR. VACHET: Right now, my facility that I have is 1,800 square foot, not the one that I want. The mat space I have now, that we're projecting, is 1,800 square foot. So my facility, in the mornings, we usually have about 20 to 30 guys on a really good day, but on an average you have about 15 people on the mat. And then we still have the other half of the building which can pack out maybe 30 people. But my goal is to make that a fitness area, and exclusive, no more than 16 people, where we can actually tailor to everybody versus having a cluster of chaos going on.

MAYOR STRAUSS: What changes are you doing to the inside of the building?

MR. VACHET: The only thing that I actually have to apply -- actually, the plumber came in. I want to add a shower. We're going to put a locker room wall and another locker room wall, and that's it. Everything else is throw the mats, throw some cool lights up there, and color. That's it. And to be honest, we need the

electricians. They have to fix the light in the back. 1 MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. If you're successful this evening, please stick closely with the 3 Building Department and make sure that everything is done to code. We don't need a tragedy because of an 5 unlicensed electrician or plumber or something. 6 7 MR. VACHET: Everything was certified by Mineola too. I did my due diligence. I called 8 everybody. 9 MAYOR STRAUSS: I appreciate that. 10 That's 11 great. 12 Deputy Mayor? MR. PEREIRA: Thank you. 13 I don't have a lot of questions. Now, you 1.4 15 mentioned fitness, but you're not going to have fitness 16 equipment per se. This is all going to be, like, body 17 weight, or are you going to have --MR. VACHET: We have some, just like a squat 18 19 rack and a couple of light weights. But everything else is going to be row machine, treadmills, and custom 20 21 state-of-the-art boxing bags. MR. PEREIRA: And if you're approved tonight, 22 when are you ready to kind of hit the ground running? 23 When would you like to --24 25 MR. VACHET: Tomorrow morning. Our lease is

1	over January. So as soon as you guys approve I'm
2	going to Portugal next week. So I have an entire two
3	weeks where I'm not doing anything until I'm back. And
4	then we have a month to pack and build and yeah, It's
5	going to be fun.
6	MR. PEREIRA: Now this is the site of the,
7	like, old studio where there's the game room, that set of
8	stores, right, next to the Chase?
9	MR. VACHET: So it's McDonald's, that store
10	there was the antique place
11	MR. CORBETT: Right.
12	MR. VACHET: my store
13	MR. CORBETT: Right.
14	MR. VACHET: and Chase Bank is on the side.
15	MR. PEREIRA: And that parking lot, is that
16	part of you?
17	MR. VACHET: They own all of that. That
18	parking lot
19	MR. PEREIRA: Are those eight spots, whatever
20	it is, you can park there. They can park on the street.
21	MR. VACHET: Yup.
22	MR. PEREIRA: And I'm sure some of them can
23	park
24	MR. VACHET: That's why I wanted that spot,
25	because I have kids that I have to help parents bring the

little ones out to run. We have double-parking in 1 Williston Park. 2 MR. PEREIRA: You're on Hillside Avenue 3 currently? 4 MR. VACHET: Yes. 5 MR. PEREIRA: I know exactly where it is. 6 Parties. Are you going to host, like, any kids 7 parties? 8 MR. VACHET: We've never done that. Parents 9 have asked, but our space is so small because we have --10 nah. I haven't thought about doing that yet. I don't 11 know, but as of right now no. 12 MR. PEREIRA: OK. And as the Mayor stated, 13 obviously not only with plumbing and electrical, but 14 certainly we're requesting you work with Mr. Whalen in 15 the Building Department also when it comes to signs, when 16 17 you choose your sign. Your sign in Williston Park is very nice, but just make sure it's up to code with the 18 Building Department. This way you can open and hit the 19 ground running when you're ready. OK? 20 MR. VACHET: Definitely. 21 MR. PEREIRA: And then, at the end of the 22 meeting, we'd like you to do a little jiu-jitsu 23 demonstration with our attorney over there. 24 25 Thank you, Mayor.

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MR. DURHAM: Thank you.

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How are you doing?

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MR. VACHET: OK.

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MR. DURHAM: Kids classes, how do you introduce

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them, teach them? Just the basics of what your plan is

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now, what you're doing, and how you're. . . MR. VACHET: So whether it's kids or adults we do the same thing. We have our routine. Come in. explain to the parents what we do. We tell them all the

benefits, because most people don't know what we do. So

they join the group. When they're in the group we do the

the kids that are in class, some are a higher level than others. And then, if they have an issue or something, we obviously correct them.

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But one thing that we do, that most places don't, is we don't test kids. Why? Because I never liked testing. I don't like tests. I'm not good at it. So I came up with my own way. I test them every single day, but they don't know it. The parents love it. What happens is I'll do a move, or my instructors, or my coaches that I'm bringing up, they'll do a move and then we just repeatedly do it. And at the end of the month we're like, Show me this move. And they actually have to tell me how to grab, how to do a trip, and why are they doing it. And then little by little not only are they using their muscle memory, their brains. They're constantly -- we had kids that parents walk in and the kid had no confidence and he's getting good grades. We're actually giving them an internal switch because we lost a bet. You won. We said: If he gets his grades up high we'll buy him a switch for a ceremony this Sunday, and he won, which is -- makes me happy. The parents are This is a new kid, helps out, does everything, You like: And that's how I run the classes. Right after they learn technique we do light training and then, if they did, you know, everything good, we play some games

1	with them.
2	MR. DURHAM: Now the certifications, if they
3	get certified or like you said, you have black belt,
4	or whatever do you do that, or is that
5	MR. VACHET: No. No. I got to go through the
6	federations.
7	MR. DURHAM: So the kid goes to the
8	federations
9	MR. VACHET: Yes.
10	MR. DURHAM: and everything is submitted and
11	then they can go
12	MR. VACHET: Well for me to promote my
13	students?
14	MR. DURHAM: If your students need a
15	certification.
16	MR. VACHET: Oh. No. I handle my
17	students, but
18	MR. DURHAM: I'm saying if they were getting
19	any certification.
20	MR. PEREIRA: Different degrees of belt.
21	MR. VACHET: Yes. It's just five belts, white,
22	blue, purple, brown, black. But I take care of that
23	because I am a certified instructor under the federation.
24	So let's say, like, you guys are the
25	federation. I have to go through you, kind of like what

1	we're doing, but now I have the authority to promote the
2	next person that's coming up.
3	MR. DURHAM: OK.
4	MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Walsh?
5	MR. WALSH: Yes.
6	Hello. How are you, Mr. Vachet?
7	MR. VACHET: Hey. What's going on?
8	MR. WALSH: Just a few questions.
9	How many employees do you think you'll have?
10	MR. VACHET: Right now my staff is five people.
11	MR. WALSH: Five employees.
12	MR. VACHET: Right.
13	MR. WALSH: And about how many students do you
14	have now?
15	MR. VACHET: Probably under 140.
16	MR. WALSH: 140. And you hope to grow this to
17	how many do you think?
18	MR. VACHET: Probably another 100.
19	MR. WALSH: 100.
20	MR. VACHET: Another 100.
21	MR. WALSH: So you're getting smaller.
22	MR. PEREIRA: No. No.
23	MR. VACHET: No. No. On top of.
24	MR. WALSH: Oh. You would like to increase.
25	MR. VACHET: Yes. I don't want to get smaller.

1	MR. WALSH: OK. So you'd like to increase it
2	by 100.
3	MR. VACHET: Yes.
4	MR. WALSH: Are these all classes or cause I
5	see you have 6:00 a.m. to 9:00, 9:00 to 11:00 on
6	Saturday, are these all classes, or can people just come
7	when they want?
8	MR. VACHET: No. Just classes. You can't have
9	randoms come in.
10	So, like, let's say a parent comes in. They
11	have to sit on the bench, because they can't be walking
12	around because they're not under our liability. So they
13	have to they all know when they come in, OK, you got
14	to sit down.
15	MR. WALSH: Yes.
16	And is this the same discipline as, like, this
17	famous Royce Gracie jiu-jitsu?
18	MR. VACHET: Yes.
19	MR. WALSH: Right. So he's pretty
20	professional, this guy.
21	MR. VACHET: Yes.
22	MR. WALSH: Very disciplined.
23	MR. VACHET: Great guy.
24	MR. WALSH: My last question is it has no
25	reflection on however you vote but what's the price

1 range? MR. VACHET: It varies. I actually keep mine 2 way under. For my spot now we're doing 135 for the kids, 3 and that's for the teens, and then we do 135 for adults twice a week, or 155 unlimited. But for this spot it has 5 to go up higher because I'm going to get --6 MR. WALSH: Per month? 7 MR. VACHET: Yes, per month, which is a lot 8 lower, because I also don't charge initial fees, 9 testings. Some places charge custom uniforms that they 10 have to wear. 11 MR. WALSH: I get it. My son was in that years 1.2 ago, and I know. 13 MR. VACHET: It's expensive. Very expensive. 14 MR. WALSH: Of course everybody has to eat, so 15 they have to build up things, and I get that. 16 You know, I think that this is -- first of all, 17 we always like to see the stores filled around Mineola, 18 and I think this is a good use of that area. 19 That's all I have to say. Thank you, Mayor. 20 MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. Thank you. 21 22 Anything else, Mr. Vachet? MR. VACHET: No. That's about it. 23 MAYOR STRAUSS: Have a seat. Don't go too far. 24 I'm going to open up to any public comment. 25

Scalero, Village Clerk. 10 "Dated November 14, 2018." 11 MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you. 12 Mr. Gibbons, do you need to read it at all? 13 MR. GIBBONS: Mayor, the purpose of this Local 14 15 Law is that people may have peace and quiet early in the 16 morning, and at the dinner hour and thereafter, free from construction work. If you don't mind, I'm going to read 17 it. 18 MAYOR STRAUSS: Please. Thank you. 19 20 MR. GIBBONS: Section 376-17A, Hours for 21 Construction Work and Repair. 22 For purposes of this Section work shall be 23 defined as excavation, demolition, or construction work, repairs, painting, installation of equipment, electrical 24

work, or plumbing work, or any work similar to the

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foregoing, either in the interior of or on the exterior of any structure or its premises.

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Except for emergency repairs, it shall be unlawful in all residential zoning districts of the Village of Mineola for any person to do work before 8:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, before 9:00 a.m. Saturday, Sunday, or legal holidays, and after 6:00 p.m. Monday through Sunday.

Except for emergency repairs, it shall be unlawful in all business-industrial zoning districts of the Village of Mineola for any person to do work before 7:00 a.m. Monday through Friday, before 9:00 a.m. Saturday, Sunday, or legal holidays, and after 6:00 p.m. Monday through Sunday.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.

Folks, we have heard many times over the years from the residents about being woken up early in the morning from people being bothered by contractors working on building their house, improving their homes, businesses, which we certainly encourage; however, we don't want you woken up at 6:00 o'clock in the morning, and there was nothing on the books.

So now we put it on the books. We think it's a fair time frame for work to begin and end. And there are, as it mentioned in the law, conditions for

emergencies. If you have to work past 6:00 o'clock to do something, or start a little earlier because you have to do something, that will be worked out with the Building Department. But many times somebody comes in with an application, the applicant will be provided with these hours, and hopefully they'll be adhered to. Otherwise they'll have to deal with us and the court.

Any comments from the Board? Deputy Mayor?

MR. PEREIRA: No. I think you said it all,

Mayor. It's pretty straightforward.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Durham?

MR. DURHAM: Yes. My one comment would be the enforcement for, say, I know roofers and stuff start early in the morning and they're trying to get the job done in a complete day. So if a roofer starts at 6:30, 7:00, tearing apart your neighbor's -- the enforcement. Who are they contacting and how are they enforcing it?

MAYOR STRAUSS: They can make a complaint to the Village Hall. We won't have anybody on site there, but the complainant will have to fill out a form, sign an affidavit attesting that they started work at 6:30, and then I believe a summons will be issued, unless I'm misstating that, and then they'll be brought in front of the court.

MR. GIBBONS: Correct, Mayor.

1	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
2	MR. DURHAM: Thank you.
3	MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Walsh?
