"Application of Kristin Imperiale for a Special Use Permit pursuant to Chapter 550 of the Code of the Incorporated Village of Mineola, entitled 'Zoning,' Section 550.12 entitled 'B-1 Districts,' Subsection (B) upon the property known as 500 Jericho Turnpike, Mineola, New York, known and designated on the Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 9, Block 22, Lots 32, 131."

21	Sir, the floor is yours.
22	MR. BUTT: Good evening, Mayor, members of
23	the Board of Trustees.
24	MAYOR STRAUSS: Good evening.

MR. BUTT: My name is Edward Butt. I am from

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the firm of Edward Paul Butt, Architect representing actually Mr. and Mrs. Vivona, Michele and Jerome Vivona of the American Dance Theater Workshop. That is the applicant for tonight.

To give you a brief understanding, first I'd like to pass out sort of a little file that you might want to read through. Call that Exhibit A.

The applicant is seeking relief from parking that currently exists on the site of approximately 20 spaces that are provided where at least seven is required. This space has not changed in volume or size.

The American Theater Dance Workshop has been in this area for over 35 years. The actual Jerome Vivona was a resident of Mineola. They have been teaching dance and theater for, like I said, 35 years successfully and are looking to take over the space which is known as 500 Jericho Turnpike.

As you can see, I can just describe the access. All curb cuts and everything else that are proposed --

MAYOR STRAUSS: Sir, if you'd just bring this over to the podium. We televise the meeting, and we have people at home that are watching this.

MR. BUTT: I didn't know I was on camera.

So this is a one-way in and a one-way out.

You might be able to see on the smaller drawings if you have them before you. That's the way it currently exists now, and that's the way we are proposing to keep it.

The -- the spaces are in the center. We are providing handicapped spaces, and we are flanking on both sides as it currently exists right now.

The way the function of this -- the way the function of this dance studio works is primarily a drop off and pick-up sort of an arrangement. They have about five employees total, and they would be the only people that would probably be using the spaces unless there's someone to offset who might want to go there.

But for normal purposes, this operation occurs on off working hours for the most part, so I don't believe it has that tremendous amount of impact on our traffic. It's some sort of an after school kind of thing and also a lot of time on weekends.

They have three classrooms right now. All of them have pianos in them.

If you read what their operation is, it's been very successful for a very long time. We actually have been asked to provide sprinklers in the building to make it safer because of the change in use. We have

had discussions with the Nassau County Fire Marshall's office, and this will become a fully sprinklered first floor building. Right now, there are sprinklers in the building that protect the second floor office space, but now we would be having sprinklers in all of the spaces on the floor itself. So it's going to be a safer building as well.

As far as also we are going to put in a new Nassau County approved fire alarm system. The one that's there is antiquated. I don't even know if it works. So the safety of the building will be enhanced substantially by what we're looking to do here.

And there is quite a bit of work that will need to be done. I'm really here to answer any questions that you might have about the operation and how it works, and I turn it over to you, Mr. Mayor.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you very much, sir.

For those that are here, we are talking about as everyone knows the old Blockbuster Video site, a site that has seen a change over the last number of years of several businesses, and we certainly hope that and I think and I believe that this will be the type of business that could really make a long-term stay at that location which I think would be great.
