MR. SCALERO: Ladies and gentlemen, please silence all pagers and cell phones. In the event of an emergency there are exits located in the rear of the room.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Good evening, ladies and gentlemen. We have a hearing tonight regarding the property at 275 Jericho Turnpike.

Mr. Scalero?

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MR. SCALERO: Yes.

"Please take notice that the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of Mineola will hold a public hearing on Wednesday, May 10, 2017, at 6:30 p.m. at the Village Hall, 155 Washington Avenue, Mineola, New York 11501, or at some other location to be hereafter designated by the Board of Trustees, in order to receive public comment upon the following:

"Application of Great Neck Games & Productions for an extension/modification of a Special Use Permit previously granted for one year pursuant to Chapter 550 of the Code of the Incorporated Village of Mineola, entitled 'Zoning', Section 550.12, entitled 'B-1 Districts', to now have a permanent Special Use Permit to host parties on nights in addition to Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday, at the property known as 275 Jericho Turnpike, Mineola, New York 11501, and designated on the

1 Nassau County Land and Tax Map as Section 9, Block 391, Lot 115. 2 "The Village of Mineola does not discriminate 3 on the basis of handicapped status in administration or 4 access to or employment in its projects and activities. 5 Joseph R. Scalero has been directed to coordinate 6 compliance with non-discrimination requirements of the 7 Federal Revenue Sharing Regulations. 8 "At this scheduled meeting of its Board's of 9 trustees, reserved decisions from previous meetings, if 10 any, may be acted upon by the Board of Trustees. 11 "At the aforesaid time and place, all 12 interested persons will be given an opportunity to be 13 heard. 14 "By order of the Board of Trustees of the 15 Incorporated Village of Mineola. Joseph R. Scalero, 16 17 Village Clerk. "Dated April 10, 2017." 18 MAYOR STRAUSS: Report on mailings? Do you 19 have a report on mailings? 20 MR. SCALERO: Yes. I have, Mayor, a report 2.1 2.2 from Building Superintendent Dan Whalen that there was an Affidavit of Mailing received and the mailings seem to be 23 in order. 24

We also have before you one letter that was

3	MAYOR STRAUSS: Great. Thank you, sir.
4	MR. SCALERO: Thank you.
5	MAYOR STRAUSS: Mr. Gibbons, anything?
6	MR. GIBBONS: Yes.
7	The Nassau County Planning Commission has
8	previously given us an LD on this application, local
9	determination, and I would ask for a resolution declaring
10	this a Type II Action.
11	MAYOR STRAUSS: Can I have a motion?
12	MR. WALSH: Motion.
13	MAYOR STRAUSS: Motion by Trustee Walsh.
14	Second?
15	MR. PEREIRA: Second.
16	MAYOR STRAUSS: Trustee Pereira.
17	All in favor?
18	MR. DURHAM: Aye.
19	MR. PEREIRA: Aye.
20	MR. CUSATO: Aye.
21	MR. WALSH: Aye.
22	MAYOR STRAUSS: Aye.
23	Opposed?
24	Carried. Thank you.
25	Ladies and gentlemen, this will be the format

for tonight's hearing. The applicant will make its presentation, call any witnesses. There will be an interaction with the Board, at which time I'll ask the applicants to sit down, and then we'll open up to public discussion.

I ask anybody approaching the podium to please speak clearly, slowly, state your name and your address so we can have it in the record.

Gentlemen?

MR. HATAMI: Good evening. My name is Victor Hatami, H-A-T-A-M-I. My address is 5 The Crest, Woodbury, New York 11797.

I want to thank the Honorable Mayor and the Trustees for giving me the opportunity to be here tonight again. This is my fourth appearance for my place of business, which is Great Neck Games & Productions, 275 Jericho Turnpike. I have graciously got permit from the town here to operate last year and the previous two years. So that means this is my third year.

To my knowledge I obeyed all the regulations and requirements to run the place, and to my knowledge I did not get any complaints from the neighbors.

And what I want to do is to get a permanent permit, if it's possible, so this way I can invest in my property to make it better and more convenient for people

who use it. 1 As far as the hours that I'm operating, it's 2 7:00 to 11:00. I'm happy with that, as long as I get 3 another half an hour just when people leave. 4 And as far as the dates, I am OK with what 5 you're giving me but sometimes, in the holidays and so 6 on, I would like to have parties. So those are the dates 7 that people, because of the holidays, use my premises. 8 I appreciate your concern, and hopefully you 9 10 grant my request. MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you, Mr. Hatami. 11 So I'm to understand, if I understand this 12 correctly, that you operate now 7:00 to 11:00 p.m.? 13 MR. HATAMI: Yes. 14 MAYOR STRAUSS: And you're looking to extend 15 that to 11:30? 16 MR. HATAMI: Yes, because my party starts at 17 7:00, and so they finish at 11:00. Right now I try to 18 make it three hours party. The party people want four 19 hours. And so 7:00 to 11:00, it usually takes 15 20 minutes, half an hour, for them to leave. 21 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. And you currently operate 22 what nights of the week? 2.3 MR. HATAMI: Thursday, Friday, Saturday, 24

Sunday.

MAYOR STRAUSS: And so you want to keep those 1. but have the ability to add just holidays. 2 MR. HATAMI: Just holidays, if it's possible. 3 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. So do you have -- you 4 still maintain a current license agreement with the 5 6 property owner at 285? MR. HATAMI: Correct. 7 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. Great. 8 9 Deputy Mayor? MR. PEREIRA: Thank you. 10 Thank you, Mr. Hatami. 11 And first I do want to say that I do recognize 12 and I do want to thank you for, you know, from the first 13 time that you were before this Board that I was here it 14 was somewhat of a problematic relationship, and I think 15 we've overcome that. And I do appreciate the fact that 16 17 for the last two years you have complied with our concerns. And it seems that the complaints have been 18 kept to a minimum. So you have held up your end of the 19 bargain, and I do appreciate that. 20 21 MR. HATAMI: Thank you. MR. PEREIRA: You come back. This is your 22 third time coming back looking for an extension or a 23 permanent extension. So . . . But having said that, I 24

have a couple of questions.

1	MR. HATAMI: Sure.
2	MR. PEREIRA: Now when you say holidays, do you
3	mean so the Fourth of July is on a Tuesday this year,
4	you want to operate Monday night, or you want to operate
5	Tuesday night, or do you want to operate both?
6	I would think it would be the evening before
7	the holiday.
8	MR. HATAMI: That's correct. The evening
9	before, yes.
10	MR. PEREIRA: So if the holiday falls on a
L1	weekday, other than Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday,
L2	you would want the evening before the holiday, which
13	would make sense.
L4	MR. HATAMI: It makes sense. But the most
15	concern I have is Christmastime. Sometimes I do get some
L6	companies coming for dinner or something, getting
L7	together for a holiday party.
18	MR. PEREIRA: That would be a very unique kind
L9	of
20	MR. HATAMI: Very unique. Very unique.
21	Usually we tell them we're only available Thursday and
22	Friday, but just in case.
23	MR. PEREIRA: I just want to make clear because
24	the application gives the impression, and I think that
25	the residents might have gotten the impression, you want

1	to go to seven-days-a-week 365 days a year.
2	MR. HATAMI: No.
3	MR. PEREIRA: That is not what you want to do.
4	MR. HATAMI: No.
5	MR. PEREIRA: So you want to keep the Thursday
6	through Sunday and just add the occasional holiday eve.
7	MR. HATAMI: Correct.
8	MR. PEREIRA: OK. Now you mentioned in your
9	comments that you would like this permit to be granted on
10	a permanent basis because you want to invest in your
11	property and you want to improve your business.
12	Well I'll say this: I think your property
13	looks great. You have invested in it. It looks
14	wonderful.
15	MR. HATAMI: Thank you.
16	MR. PEREIRA: Certainly you did not spare, you
17	know, any expense in beautifying your property.
18	So what do you mean by improving your business
19	and investing in your property? What else would you do
20	to it?
21	It seems fine to me.
22	MR. HATAMI: My major concern is I want to put
23	an elevator.
24	MR. PEREIRA: OK.
25	MR. HATAMI: And that's a very big most

people come in, I don't have -- I have lift and so on, 1 but it's not proper for people to use, my guests. 2 What I'd like to do is -- for those people who 3 want to book my place and they have elderly people, you 4 know, parents and so on who want to get up there -- I 5 want to put an elevator. As you know, to put an elevator 6 is kind of expensive. So that's the major thing. 7 And also, I want to beautify the front of my 8 9 store still, make it better by putting all brick and put some kind of canopy. 10 MR. PEREIRA: OK. But the improvements would 11 not include anything that would essentially change the 12 use of your business, such as adding a kitchen or --13 MR. HATAMI: Absolutely not. 14 MR. PEREIRA: -- or any kind of outdoor patio 1.5 None of that. seating. 16 MR. HATAMI: None of that. 17 MR. PEREIRA: The conditions from the original 18 permit, such as music will be contained within the 1.9 premises, and lighting and all that, so as not to affect 20 the neighborhood, that would continue. 21 MR. HATAMI: That's continued. 22 MR. PEREIRA: The improvements to your business 23 at this point would be to add an elevator, to beautify 24

the front, perhaps put brick pavers, and a different sign

1	or awning.
2	MR. HATAMI: Correct.
3	MR. PEREIRA: But it would not change the
4	nature of your business.
. 5.	MR. HATAMI: Correct.
6	MR. PEREIRA: OK. Thank you.
7	That's all, Mayor.
8	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
9	Trustee Cusato?
10	MR. CUSATO: Good evening, sir.
11	So, you know what, this is a hearing. I don't
12	see but maybe one person from Marcellus here. So I think
13	most people are kind of happy that you've complied with
14	the guidelines we set for you.
15	So going back to what Deputy Mayor Pereira
16	said, so July 4 is on a Tuesday. So you're going to have
17	some kind of party on the Monday or the Tuesday?
18	MR. HATAMI: I don't have anything right now.
19	MR. CUSATO: But the point is: What happens
20	the following week?
21	If we grant you additional days, are you going
22	to have something on July the 10th, or the 11th, or 12th,
23	which is the following week?
24	MR. HATAMI: No. No.
25	MR. CUSATO: So you're just going to have

something on a particular holiday?

MR. HATAMI: Yes, because people are off the following day. So if I have it Monday, people are off Tuesday. So they might --

MR. CUSATO: But my point is: You're looking for extra days, you know. Last year we gave you Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Now you're looking for extra days. And I'm just wondering what those extra days mean. You know, are you going to have -- if we let you have -- we gave you four of the seven days of the week.

MR. HATAMI: Right.

MR. CUSATO: So --

MR. HATAMI: Like I said, I'm very happy with that. And sometimes I get a request. Like this Tuesday -- July 4, this year, is going to be Tuesday. We might have a party on Monday. And it maybe happens two or three times a year max. And that's what I'm asking for. Not much.

MR. CUSATO: So you're just asking for -- so if a holiday falls on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday, you're asking us to give you that day but not Monday, Tuesday Wednesday of every week?

MR. HATAMI: No. No. No. Not every week.

Just the holidays. Let's say July 4th is Tuesday. I'm

happy to have Monday night, and that's it. 1 MR. CUSATO: So then what would happen -- So 2 Christmas is on a Monday. So you would have a party on 3 maybe --4 MR. HATAMI: Nobody will have -- nobody have --5 MR. CUSATO: No. So the 24th is Sunday, but 6 then the Tuesday, or even New Year's Eve, would you have something on either day, or . . . 8 MR. HATAMI: No. No. I'm not looking for 9 anything extra what you indicated. 10 MR. CUSATO: So you're not planning to have an 11 event every -- So if we gave you the full week, you say 12 to us you're not going to do everything -- every week --13 you're not doing a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday of every 14 15 week? MR. HATAMI: Of course not, no. 16 17 MR. CUSATO: OK. All right. Thank you, Mayor. 18 MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you. 19 Trustee Durham? 20 MR. DURHAM: I just want to go back to the same 21 22 thing. And so if New Year's Eve falls on a Monday, 23 Tuesday or Wednesday, you're looking for to be able to 24 have a New Year's Eve party or that sort of thing. 25

1	MR. HATAMI: Correct.
2	MR. DURHAM: So if we put a condition with it
3	for holiday eves that fall on Monday, Tuesday AND
4	Wednesday, you're fine with that?
5	MR. HATAMI: Correct. Yes.
6	MR. DURHAM: OK. So if it's just the regular
7	calendar, the main holidays, whatever, the eves, so that
8	you could have parties.
9	I have no other questions.
10	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
11	Trustee Walsh?
12	MR. WALSH: Yes. Thank you, Mayor.
13	How are you, Mr. Hatami?
14	MR. HATAMI: Very good. Thank you.
15	MR. WALSH: I recognize you. I've seen you
16	several times here. Welcome back.
17	MR. HATAMI: Thank you.
18	MR. WALSH: The Mayor asked you about the
19	address, but I just want to make sure, you still use the
20	bank parking lot the same way you did in the past?
21	MR. HATAMI: Yes.
22	MR. WALSH: You still have the arrangement
23	with them? Nothing's changed?
24	MR. HATAMI: Yes, I do have with me the lease.
25	MR. WALSH: No. No. That's fine.

1	Nothing's changed, right?
2	MR. HATAMI: Nothing has changed. Everything
3	is the same.
4	MR. WALSH: OK. And how often at these parties
5	do have a valet system?
6	Do you ever have a valet out there?
7	MR. HATAMI: Any time that I have over 20
8	people, I have a valet system.
9	MR. WALSH: Good. So you have a valet that,
10	what, takes the cars into the bank parking lot?
11	MR. HATAMI: First they use my premises and
12	then, if they run out of space, they use the bank.
13	MR. WALSH: OK. What is your total occupancy?
14	Do you have a rough idea?
15	MR. HATAMI: I have, upstairs, about 80 people.
16	MR. WALSH: About 80 people.
17	MR. HATAMI: 80.
18	MR. WALSH: Do you ever have a party on the
19	first floor, and
20	MR. HATAMI: But let me just go a little bit
21	more into that.
22	Most of my parties are bar mitzvahs, and
23	usually we have let's say I have 80 people. Forty,
24	50, of those are all kids. So I never have 80 cars or 40
25	cars. There's ten or 15 adults that come with them, and

1	then I have those are the cars that are used. So if I
2	have 80 people, I still have max 20 cars.
3	MR. WALSH: Yes. I get it. I've been watching
4	over a long period of time, and I haven't seen any
5	problems over there with parking. I don't know exactly,
6	but
7	MR. HATAMI: Like I said, I invested in this a
8	lot of money, and a lot of years I'm in this town.
9	MR. WALSH: OK. Let me ask you this: Do you
10	ever have two parties at the same time?
11	Do you ever have a party on the first floor and
12	a party on the second floor?
13	MR. HATAMI: Never. Never.
14	MR. WALSH: And about what percentage of your
15	parties are bar mitzvahs, half, more?
16	MR. HATAMI: I say much more. About 80.
17	MR. WALSH: Eighty percent. OK.
18	And for me, as far as the holidays are
19	concerned, you either have it on the holiday, the day
20	after the holiday, the day before the holiday, as long as
21	you just have it on a holiday, that's fine with me. And
22	there aren't that many holidays involved.
23	When you say holidays, you mean legal holidays?
24	You don't include religious holidays?
25	MR. HATAMI: Legal holidays.

1	MR. WALSH: OK. Thank you. That's all.
2	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
3	Any other comments from the Board?
4	Mr. Hatami, do you want to add anything else
5	before I open it up to the public?
6	MR. HATAMI: No. I just appreciate all you
7	guys did for me. And it really made life much easier for
8	me. And I really appreciate it. And I'm here 35, now,
9	thirty-five years in Mineola. So that's my son Ian. He
10	is hopefully, he's going to be here another 35 years.
11	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
12	MR. HATAMI: Thank you.
13	MAYOR STRAUSS: If you could take a seat, I'll
14	open it up to public comment at this point.
15	MR. HATAMI: Absolutely.
16	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you, sir.
17	Anybody wishing to make a comment?
18	Yes, sir?
19	Please, when you get to the podium, state your
20	name and your address for the record.
21	MR. SIEGEL: Alan Siegel, 259 Wellington Road,
22	Mineola.
23	I know Victor a long time. I really have no
24	complaints about the parties.
25	He's talking about fixing up the front of it on

Jericho Turnpike. I think you should also consider cleaning up along Wellington. You have half concrete, half grass. I think he should have a grass buffer all the way up to Jericho. It really doesn't look that good. But I also want to make sure you take care of that grass because sometimes it gets a little long and, you know, I keep my lawn cut all the time.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Mr. Siegel, how's the parking?

MR. SIEGEL: I had one problem with them once a couple of years ago. There hasn't been a problem since.

MAYOR STRAUSS: So a couple of years ago he took care of it? You approached Mr. Hatami?

MR. SIEGEL: Actually, whatever, it wasn't even so much parking. I had cars on each side of my driveway. I'm the first house right after him.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Right.

MR. SIEGEL: There were cars parked on each side of my driveway, and I mean right on the edge of the driveway. In fact, even a police officer came by and said, I can't do anything. It's not right the way it was parked, but nothing he could do. And I have a Bronco, so it's not easy getting the Bronco out when you got cars right on the edge.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Sure. I totally understand.

MR. SIEGEL: But I complained to whoever was

running the party. They seemed to have ignored me. 1 I haven't had a problem since. 2 MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. Great. 3 MR. SIEGEL: But you know, like I said, clean 4 up along Wellington would be a nice idea too. 5 And if he's only going to have, you know, 6 basically a date for the holidays, I guess it probably 7 wouldn't be terrible. 8 MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. All right. Thank you, Mr. 9 Siegel. 10 MR. WALSH: Mr. Siegel, can I ask you a 11 question? 12 MR. SIEGEL: Yes. Sure. 13 MR. WALSH: You live in the first house. 14 you have some kind of situation where you thought that 1.5 the windows were comparison, where they could see in your 16 17 window or something. MR. SIEGEL: Yes, I did question that. 18 MR. WALSH: And was that corrected? 19 MR. SIEGEL: Well he still has the windows, but 20 now he has curtains over it. 21 MR. WALSH: Good. 22 MR. SIEGEL: And basically it's up on the 23 second floor, which I believe you don't have people 24 25 anyway. So . . .

1	MR. WALSH: So the condition was corrected.
2	MR. SIEGEL: It wasn't as bad as I thought it
3	was.
4	MR. WALSH: OK. Thank you very much.
5	MR. SIEGEL: I mean yes, that's about it.
6	I mean, I did have a question about the
7	heaters. You have them coming out the side. Shouldn't
8	it be going out the roof?
9	MAYOR STRAUSS: The heaters on the roof of the
10	building?
11	MR. SIEGEL: He vents his heat. They're coming
12	out the side of the building. I don't know if that's
13	MAYOR STRAUSS: Yes. I'll have the Building
14	Department check that.
15	MR. SIEGEL: But other than that, I'm OK.
16	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you, Mr. Siegel. We
17	appreciate you coming down this evening.
18	MR. SIEGEL: Yes. You bet.
19	MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.
20	MR. SIEGEL: Thank you.
21	MAYOR STRAUSS: Anybody else wishing to speak?
22	No one?
23	Ma'am, would you like to make any comment at
24	all?
25	VOICE: No.

1	MAYOR STRAUSS: OK. All right.
2	Mr. Hatami?
3	MR. HATAMI: Sure.
4	MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. You heard the one
5	comment about hoping that you maintain the side of your
6	property as well as the front.
7	MR. HATAMI: We really do try to do our best.
8	There is a section that is not pavement. It's just a
9	little grass. And honestly, to my knowledge, we always
10	took care of it. But if Mr. Siegel says that we didn't,
11	I'll make sure of that.
12	MR. SIEGEL: The lawn sometimes.
13	MR. HATAMI: No. I understand perfectly, and I
14	promise that
15	THE COURT: So you'll work that out.
16	MR. HATAMI: Work it out 100 percent.
17	MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. It doesn't seem
18	like it's earth-shattering, but can be annoying.
19	MR. HATAMI: Absolutely.
20	MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. Greatly appreciate
21	it.
22	Any other comments from the Board?
23	MR. CUSATO: I do.
24	Sir, just one more thing. So you will not have
25	a party on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday unless it's

1	holiday-related?
2	MR. HATAMI: Correct.
3	MR. CUSATO: OK. Thank you.
4	MAYOR STRAUSS: Great.
5	Any other comments?
6	MR. PEREIRA: I would just like to comment
7	because I think there may be some confusion again, and to
8	add to what Mr. Cusato just said. Just to be clear
9	because the application reads it can be confusing
10	if this is to be granted, we're not going to seven days a
11	week. We're maintaining exactly the same request as in
12	the past, same conditions. The only thing we're adding
13	is the occasional party on an official holiday eve.
14	MR. HATAMI: Correct.
15	MR. PEREIRA: Which would be infrequent but,
16	other than that, all the conditions remain the same.
17	MR. DURHAM: And the half hour to 11:30.
18	MR. PEREIRA: And the half hour the parties
19	will still end at 11:00.
20	MR. HATAMI: Correct.
21	MR. PEREIRA: But with permission to clean up
22	and for people to leave up until 11:30.
23	MR. HATAMI: Yes.
24	MAYOR STRAUSS: Any other comments?
25	Ma'am?

1	VOICE: Are these national holidays?
2	MAYOR STRAUSS: Ma'am, yeah.
3	If you could come up to the podium.
4	But yes, they are legal holidays.
5	MR. PEREIRA: National holidays.
6	MAYOR STRAUSS: All right. Thank you, sir.
7	Any other comments from the Board?
8	Mr. Gibbons, anything?
9	MR. GIBBONS: I just wanted to so we're
10	clear, Mr. Hatami indicated that during the Christmas
11	season someone might want to have a Christmas party.
12	That's certainly not going to take place on December
13	24th. So I think the application would be, you know, we
14	would have to flesh that out a little because you could
15	have a Christmas party on December 15th and it would be
16	more common than having one on December 24th.
17	MAYOR STRAUSS: Well I think Mr. Pereira
18	mentioned that it would be the eve of a holiday, official
19	holiday. So December 15th I don't think would fall into
20	that category.
21	MR. GIBBONS: Right. And I just want to make
22	sure, Mr. Hatami I just want to make sure of what the
23	request is, and I think your request regarding Christmas,
24	if you could just tell us about that.
25	MR. HATAMI: I am happy for what you guys gave

If I have a Christmas party, I'll make sure that I 1 do it on Thursday, and Friday, and Saturday or Sunday. 2 Nothing on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. I assure you 3 of that. 4 MR. WALSH: But let me ask you this: If 5 6 Mr. Hatami wants to have a party on the Fourth of July, that's not allowed? It has to be on the third of July? MAYOR STRAUSS: Correct. As it is now, yes, 9 unless we decide to change it. 10 MR. WALSH: So this application is for him to have this extra day the eve of. 11 MAYOR STRAUSS: The eve of the holiday. 12 And the idea was that instead of we just 13 granting the holiday, more people, as Mr. Pereira 14 15 mentioned, will be more apt to have a party on the eve of the holiday because they don't have to get up for work or 16 17 school the next day. PEREIRA: When those holidays fall on 23 Tuesday or Wednesday --24 25 MR. HATAMI: Correct.
