MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you, Mr. Scalero.

Mr. Gibbons.

MR. GIBBONS: Yes, good evening, everyone.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Good evening.

MR. GIBBONS: The crux of tonight's local law is in Section 3, and I'll read that. The Board of Trustees of the incorporated Village of Mineola County of Nassau is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing June 1, 2021 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law Section 3C. It's commonly referred to as a two percent cap, although with the inflation factor this year, it's approximately 1.31. So in order for you to consider a budget next month, it may exceed that number, you first would have to adopt the local law you have before you tonight.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Okay. Any questions from the Board?

Trustee Cusato?

TRUSTEE CUSATO: I have a comment, can I make it?



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MAYOR STRAUSS: Hold on, Deputy Mayor, folks, Deputy Mayor, I keep forgetting you, Deputy Mayor is coming to us live by technology --

DEPUTY MAYOR PEREIRA: You forget me, I have a big head sitting next to Trustee Durham, thank you, Mayor. Obviously, this is something that we do not take lightly. This is something that has been around for as long as I've been on the Board, and we've actually taken this vote in previous years as a preventative measure, however, I think it's no surprise that this year, in light of the events of the past twelve months that many municipalities, counties, states, you know, frankly, any government or taxing authority is going to find themselves in a similar situation, and I think this just allows us and protects us to go ahead and continue to do what we've been doing which is put out a responsible budget which may or may not pierce the cap, and I think that this is the prudent thing to do at this time. There are still many things that have to be ascertained in that we have to get in numbers before we decide on a final budget, but I think that this is smart of us to do this in light of the things that we already know, and we certainly hope to minimize the impact to the residents and the taxpayers, but I, for one, think this is a prudent step



to take at this time.

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Thank you, mayor.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you, well said.

Trustee Cusato?

TRUSTEE CUSATO: So, Mayor, I want to take this from a different perspective. You know, I want to go back to the late 1950s and early '60s when I was a kid and I was a member of Boy Scout Troop 221, and I always remember their motto "be prepared," and tonight we are doing that. We're taking the actions to be prepared, and I certainly agree with Mr. Pereira, I agree with what we're doing tonight.
