will open it up to the public. I ask anybody wishing to speak, approach the podium, state your name and address and speak slowly and clearly so everything can be properly recorded.

Anybody in the second row?
Yes, ma'am, come on up.

MS. DESENA: Good evening. Thank you. My name is Jen DeSena. I'm the executive director of the Manhasset Coalition against substance abuse, and I'm also running for the Town of North Hempstead Town Supervisor.

As you know, the Town of North

Hempstead has created a cannabis task

force to advise it on whether to opt

out of opening retail marijuana stores

and even consumption lounges.

I've spoken to task force last
week, and there are two more scheduled
hearings, one in September at Clinton
G. Martins Park on September 17 and the
other is October 19.

I believe they will delay a decision on whether or not to opt out

until after election day.

At the conference I spoke about, we need to protect our vulnerable youth and urged them to opt out.

There were two attorneys there, one of whom stated that the Village of Mineola had opted in to having retail stores, and which, you know, caused me to have a conversation with Mr. Walsh and find out about this hearing tonight.

I'm glad to have the opportunity
to speak about your resolution. I
commend you for prohibiting smoking and
vaping on village property.

I would encourage you also to eventually opt out of having retail stores and consumption lounges, and I hope the Town of North Hempstead and other villages do as well.

By the way, they have an email that you can write to the task force. It's called

As you know, my town, Manhasset,

was devastated this summer by the loss of three young men who were killed by a driver who was speeding and swerved into their car and had marijuana in his car. So we feel that there is no amount of tax revenue that's worth the loss of even one life.

I have had conversations with police detectives who said that they would not have been able to arrest that driver solely for having marijuana in his car, according to New York's new law.

They also confirmed there are no approved tests for marijuana impairment of drivers. So we just believe it's too soon, and any substance to reduce the amount of marijuana to sale and available to our youth would be in the best interest of public safety.

There is a huge gap in understanding today's marijuana. It's much stronger than it used to be. In the 1970s it contained 1 to 3 percent of THC.

Today, most youth use vaped
marijuana that can be as much as 95
pure THC. It's easy to purchase. It's
easy to use. And, unfortunately, we
now have what used to be daily users in
2009, 6.2 million, and in 2018 we have
13.8 million daily users of marijuana.

We had a social worker explain at our school that this looks like a child starting use in the summer and being hooked by Christmas, a daily user by Christmas.

There has been a recent study that has linked marijuana use to increased suicide and harming of themselves, and so until we can explore that risk, it's much better to wait. Why take this risk on now?

New York has not promulgated regulations about advertising. So again, why would we take on that risk for our communities now?

The United Nation's Office on drug and crime warned there is a disconnect between the real risk of marijuana and Incorporated Village of Mineola - 9-1-2021

perception. And they recommend a complete band on advertising, promoting and sponsoring marijuana to ensure that public health interest prevail over business interest.

They also call for restrictions in potency of THC to 15 percent to stop that highly addictive marijuana.

And, in fact, in the Netherlands, they did adopt the 15 percent of it.

And they have found much less cannabis use disorder.

If we learned from evidence is other states that have been legalized, such as Colorado, we've seen increased use among 12 to 17 year olds.

34 percent of high school students are reporting dabbing marijuana, which is a high-potency marijuana.

Marijuana found in the toxicology screens of 200 suicide victims in 2017, and marijuana impaired drivers located in 18 percent of traffic fatalities.

In Colorado they have just declared a state of emergency in their Incorporated Village of Mineola - 9-1-2021

mental health. They are investigating the link to suicide. They have put new restrictions on the amounts that people can buy, particularly mental marijuana of how much people can buy.

And they have launched a \$3 million educational campaign about youth use and the association with mental health problems, so that's nine years later that they have launched that educational campaign. We can do better than that. We can learn from what they've learned.

Other statistics from Colorado,
there is increased illegal marijuana
activity. There are over a thousand
dispensaries in the state outnumbering
all Starbucks and McDonald's combined,
but 52 percent of these dispensaries
are concentrated within three counties.

In fact, 64 percent of Colorado jurisdictions have band both medical and recreational marijuana.

In Colorado and Washington alcohol use has also increased along with Incorporated Village of Mineola - 9-1-2021

marijuana use. And poison control calls have increased 112 percent, and ER visits 54 percent since 2013.

We cannot rely on quote/unquote regulation as they have found in southern California at 30 percent of regulated stores had sold marijuana contained pesticides.

And in Colorado, they find butt doctors advising pregnant customers to use marijuana for morning sickness.

The Nassau County legislature
already has band smoking marijuana in
Nassau County public spaces, and Laura
Curran is supporting that bill stated,
As a parent, I know we must do
everything we can to keep cannabis out
of kids' hands and out of public spaces
where minors may be present, including
all county properties and facilities.
I look forward to signing this
legislation as a number one priority
keeping our children safe.

Towns and villages were given the right to opt out and should use it, and Incorporated Village of Mineola - 9-1-2021

incidentally, you can always opt back in, but you will not have a chance to opt out again after December 31.

In Oregon, 60 percent of municipalities have opted out.

In Michigan, over 500 jurisdictions have opted out since 2018.

In California, only 161 of states 482 municipalities have opted in. In New Jersey, municipalities have until October 21 to opt out, and almost half have done so.

The mayor of Union city, stopped marijuana operations from opening in his Town, even though he is a state senator who casts a yes vote for marijuana legalization.

Another local mayor voted to opt out saying, residents didn't vote for 17-year olds to become drug users.

They didn't vote for some overtaxed products, so some MS-13 gangbanger can come in here and undercut the legal market.

And many jurisdictions simply want to wait until the new cannabis commission puts out regulations, and we should wait too.

We've been fooled by powerful corporations before. It took 50 years for the tobacco industry to admit its products were harmful, and they are still mitigating with the FDA over new graphic health warning labels.

Incidentally, Altria, an investor in creating in marijuana and Jewel is none other than Marlboro with a new name.

We were fooled by the vaping industry which claimed its products were for adults most cessation but which paid teen influencers for advertising on social media.

We were fooled by the opiate
industry. They concealed evidence that
their products were addictive. They
ignored massive orders for pain
medication from small pain management
shops that were supplying people's

1 addictions. 2 And one of the former Purdue 3 farmer executives now has his own 4 marijuana company. 5 Teva Pharmaceuticals, a defendant 6 in the New York Attorney General's 7 trap out on Long Island now is a 8 medical marijuana distributor in 9 Israel. 10 Constellation Brands, maker of 11 Corona Beer has a 38 percent stake in 12 canopy growth. 13 Anheuser-Busch is partnering in 14 Canada's Tilray to make 15 marijuana-infused drinks. 16 We have been fooled by 17 legislatures who claim they are serving social justice. 18 19 Marijuana possession was 2.0 decriminalized in 2019, and they did 21 nothing to advance the expungement 22 process. 23 Advancing social justice takes 24 real targeted training and education. 25 Instead, they offer another addictive

drug that will harm underprivileged communities.

The real motive is money and it will go to large corporations because buying a license from the Office of Cannabis Management will be too expensive.

Nationally, in the states that legalize less than 2 percent of dispensaries are owned by minorities.

Yes, we want jobs but we have so many other needs in the Town of North Hempstead. We want businesses that lift up our youth.

Increased accessibility and acceptability means more young people will use marijuana.

Clearly, a minimum age of 21 doesn't work. Marijuana is legal but not safe. People say we should treat it like alcohol and tobacco, but these are our biggest killers.

Each year more than 480,000

Americans die prematurely from diseases

caused by an exposure to tobacco

1	smoke. Each year 88,000 die from
2	alcohol. Legalizing and regulating
3	does not make something safe.
4	I encourage you to take the first
5	step to educate the public and
6	protecting your youth and the safety of
7	your residents. Thank you.
