MCGURN: My name is Susan McGurn. 15 address is 258B Herricks Road, it's one block south of 16 Jericho Turnpike, that's the business that we're 17 currently operating out of. 18 MAYOR STRAUSS: Most of us remember -- so if 19 20 you could just go over --MS. MCGURN: Basically, in a nutshell, we were 21 operating in Mineola as Body in Balance Yoga and Pilates 22 23 with Thai Yoga Massage, and we are looking to move into 24 111 East Jericho Turnpike because we want to pay cheaper

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and we're struggling as a small business to make it and we want to continue our business. We have a lot of patrons. You know, we built our business out of integrity and a reputation for running an integrity and a clean business, so we'd like to continue. That's basically it.

MAYOR STRAUSS: What are the hours that you're going to be operating?

MS. MCGURN: Usually, we have hours everyday but we're not necessarily there all day long. So it's usually in the morning, depending on our schedules. So let's say maybe from 9:30 to 12:30 and maybe, you know, 5:00 to 7:00 or 7:30, it just depends on our schedules. Sometimes we're there for private clients in the afternoon so our hours fluctuate all the time, except for our set schedule of classes.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Just so it's clear for everybody out there, there is a level of familiarity out here. They have both -- what is it 2013?

MS. MCGURN: 2011.

MAYOR STRAUSS: 2011 already.

Back in 2011, they came before the Board to open up the business they currently have on Herricks Road, so we are familiar with the operation. And you're just looking to relocate, as you said, to 111 East

2	How many people will be in the classes at one
3	time?
4	MS. MCGURN: In our regular group classes which
5	we have, maybe a handful let's see we have about
6	seven group classes that we offer, possibly 10, maybe 15.
7	It's relatively small. And our Pilate's Reformer, which
8	is the apparatus, the most we can have is four people,
9	which is the main bulk of our business.
10	MAYOR STRAUSS: Okay. Mr. Pereira?

12	to keep the same business and business model, doing the
13	same thing in just a different location?

16	you're just a block off of Jericho and now you're going
17	to be on Jericho, about a mile and a half east?
18	MS. MCGURN: Right.

20	business in any way, you're not offering any new
21	products, for lack of a better term?
22	MS. MCGURN: No.
23	TRUSTEE PEREIRA: How do the size of the spaces
24	compare?
25	MS. MCGURN: Basically, it's a little bit

1 smaller, square footage wise, that we're going to. 2 Square footage wise it's a little bit smaller, however, 3 the way it's situated, it works fine for what we have to 4 do. 5 Now, everything is inside the studio: The bathrooms are inside the studio, the reception area is 6 inside the studio. We are in this location -- the reception area is outside of the studio and the bathrooms 9 are outside the studio. So that space kind of lends 10 itself to that. 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be there during the day. You are aware that Sherman Williams, in their lease, owns about 90 percent of those parking spaces in that parking lot?

MS. MCGURN: No, I'm not aware of that.

I know that because the manager of the Sherman Williams told me that about a year ago. He also told me that the side door, which would be on the southeast corner, beyond the east wall, the southeast wall there's a door there. That door comes from the second floor for emergency purposes, but Sherman Williams keeps that locked because it goes immediately into their store. I saw it. When you come down the stairs you can immediately use the left door into Sherman Williams. He told me there's only two keys and the two managers have the keys of that. I don't know how that works, but your exit is only in the front of the building. I just want you to be aware of that.

MS. MCGURN: Okay.

TRUSTEE WALSH: And Sherman Williams is active with a lot of painters during the day, not at night at all, and the last applicants for that upstairs was going to be mostly at night. You will be there during the day, so you really won't be able to park too much in the parking lot, unless Sherman Williams allows you to.

Maybe you should look at your lease and see how many

parking spaces you're allowed. If you can, try to keep your people from parking on the side street because that's always an issue running into the neighbors. You certainly can't enforce it, but if you can ask your people to try to stay out of the neighborhood. If you're going to have a lot of people -- about how many are in each class?

MS. MCGURN: Like I said, the bulk of our business is reformer and it's the most four. It doesn't mean that it's always four. There's two to four people.

TRUSTEE WALSH: Two to four to six.

MS. MCGURN: In the other classes there may be six to ten people coming into a class.

TRUSTEE WALSH: Is it mostly children being dropped off and their parents pick them up or --

MS. MCGURN: No, it's not children.

TRUSTEE WALSH: All adults, okay. If you can just tell them to try to park somewhere on Jericho Turnpike. That's it. Thank you.

OLIVEIRA: My name is Monica Oliveira, 211 Second Street, Mineola, New York. 18 Good evening, ladies and gentlemen, Mayor 19 20 Strauss and Members of the Board. My name is Monica 21 Oliveira as I've already mentioned. I'm here today with 22 my brother Andre Oliveira, and my cousins Andrea Alvez 23 and Amanda Alvez. I'm here to present our Application for a Special Use Permit for use at 211 Second Street in 24 25 Mineola. The within Application is made pursuant to



Chapter 30, Article 3, Section -- Village Code and the Tax Map designation for the premises is Section 9, Block 452, Lot 581.

And with me this evening, as I've mentioned, are my co-owners and operators of our business.

And just a little background, we were all born and raised -- well, I should say my brother and I were born in Mineola and for most of our lives we've been involved in a lot of the community here in Mineola, because this is where my heart comes back to. And my cousins as well have been born and raised and attended the Mineola School District.

So with that being said, it is respectfully submitted that the instant application has no additional impact upon health, safety and the welfare of the community beyond any other use. It is already absolutely permitted as a right without the need for the Board's approval. Of course being of food use, a public hearing is required in order to allow the Village of Mineola and the Board of Trustees the opportunity to inquire as to the specifics of the proposed use. And it is respectfully submitted that the instant application will have no greater impact on the community other than the use permitted in the district. In effect, it is a retail establishment which sells food.

So with that being said, I want to go a little bit into the product itself, as the name speaks for itself. It's a Costa Nova Waffle, but it's a little bit deceiving because it's not the traditional waffle that you would think of. It's actually something that I would probably say is a hybrid between a crepe and a waffle cone. And that could be filled with whatever you may like, such as Nutella or fresh fruits. It's different. It's new and exciting and it certainly adds to some of the diversity that we're really trying to bring down to the new downtown area of Mineola that we're trying to revitalize. And I think it's really something exciting for us.

With that being said, most of the time our business is intended to be -- a lot of it to be run by

One thing that I think is special about the product in the area itself is that, unlike the crepe, our product is actually very portable, it's on the go and you can eat it wrapped up and -- that's really significant for the area that we are placing it, close to the train, the hospital, you know, a lot of the commuters. I think it's a great product for them.

I think that it really, certainly will be beneficial, it would be a great addition to the area down there.



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family. We're all going to be very actively there and also after which time we would be hiring at least two employees to be there full-time as well. But it's very much a family-run business.

We had already tried and presented this, there were two events here in Mineola this past summer. We had the Portuguese Festival and Portugal Day. And we had a great response from everyone and everyone was really asking "Where are you guys going to be next?" And we said, "Certainly, when we do open one day it will be in Mineola." So I'm glad that we finally have been able to get to this point. And, you know, really with -- I think I pretty much summarized most of the points of everything and we're really excited to do this and have this come to Mineola.

With that I want to end that, you know, it's respectfully submitted and that the proposed uses is in fact in harmony with and will positively contribute to the growth and the development of the community and its general welfare. And we respectively request that this Application for Special Use Permit be granted in all respects.

And I just wanted to also add to that that I, you know, all of us, we really want to be involved in the community and I think that it's important to have -- I

think I consider myself relatively young, but to have a nice young group of people and try to keep people here in Mineola, it has a lot to offer. And I think that sometimes it's late at night and you're looking for that treat. We have Ralph's, which is great, you pick up and go. And I think this is going to be something similar to that. I think it's going to be bringing a lot of people to the downtown area now, especially, with all the new things going up and new residents to the community.

And actually, I spoke with Mr. Lubrano. We already joined the Chamber of Commerce and we'll be at the street fair this weekend as well. I hope that most of you, if you're available, will stop by and try it.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Definitely.

MS. OLIVEIRA: And I just wanted to show you guys very quickly our logo. Just a little background, it kind of all started -- my brother and I when we were growing up we used to go with our parents to Portugal just about every summer. My mom, I should say is from a little nautical fisherman's town where all the homes in that area are, by law, striped. So that kind of tied in our whole striped house. And this specialty is specifically from that home region in Portugal, which is Aveiro. Specifically, our area that we're relating to is Costa Nova. So that's where the name comes from. And my



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brother and I always growing up we were like -- we want to do this, we want to do this. And our parents are like, well, you're going to go to college. So last year we're like, all right, we did college, we finished our Master's, we're working, can we do this now. And they're like, all right, now we can do it.

MS. ALVEZ: I think we all finished the same year.

MS. OLIVEIRA: We all finished the same year.
We've been wanting to do this for a few years now. We
wanted to do the fair. We spoke to our cousins and we
are like, hey, we can't just do it, my brother and I. We
need an extra hand. She joined in, she got enthusiastic.
And then after the fairs we were like all right, are we
all ready to do this and we kind of all decided to just
come together now and try to do this now.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Fantastic. Thank you very much for staying in Mineola. Again, I appreciate it, we all appreciate it.

I do have a couple of questions. What are the hours that you'll be open?

MS. OLIVEIRA: So initially, the first month or so I'm planning to have the hours during the week to make mainly the times that people are working, probably between 9:00 and 7:00 p.m. That would be Monday through



Thursday. On Fridays and Saturdays I did want to stay a open a little bit later to kind of allow someone on their journey looking for a quick stop for dessert place after dinner. So on Fridays and Saturdays we were looking somewhere between 9:00 and 10:00.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Closed on Sunday, I guess?

MS. OLIVEIRA: Yes. Initially, to start, to be quite honest, I would prefer to be open on Sundays but not as late, to be open until 5:00 or 6:00 in the evening.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Deliveries, how are they going to be made and what's the volume? How many trucks do you think you'll get a week or a day?

MS. OLIVEIRA: The deliveries are going to be next to none, maybe one delivery a month. Our product is mainly consistent of batter and that's something that I'm going to be purchasing so nobody will be delivering that. So all the components used to make the batter, all the things we pick up on our own, the only deliveries that we really will be having is some of our imported coffee, special things that we'll need once or twice a month.

MAYOR STRAUSS: How are you going to handle the garbage?

MS. OLIVEIRA: The garbage, I'm going to have the Village -- I'm going to be using the Village's





services. And I understand that they are from Monday through Saturday. I understand there's no garbage removal on Sunday.

Again, our product, again, does not have a lot of waste that's produced, meaning, we're going to have coffee grounds and either paper towels. So for Sundays we will be containing it within our shop to then be put out on Monday morning.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Great. Mr. Pereira?

MR. PEREIRA: Welcome. So now in the interest of full disclosure -- first of all, I have a couple of former students standing up here, but that is not in the interest of full disclosure.

Actually, I think we have somebody in medicine, we have somebody in engineering, we have teaching education, we have a little bit of everything. But I have to tell you that -- and we always get great products up here. I have one very, very happy nine year old boy at home right now. The fact that there is going to be, if we approve this, a crepe, a Portuguese place is awesome. You guys have to try this. It's really, really good. It's probably not good if you eat it before you go to the doctor the next day, but other than that -- and I think it's absolutely delicious. It's a great idea. I actually happened to be in the Village this past summer

and my favorite is Kit Kat. I think everybody knows
where the spot is, the spot is that little tiny shop
behind the corner coffee shop. It's a location I think
is ideal for this. It's a very niche business, it's a
very small business, and I think that spot is perfect for
it. It's not really a residential area of foot traffic.

We wish you luck and let me know when the grand

We wish you luck and let me know when the grand opening is because -- and let me know if you have a Kit Kat.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Thank you.

Mr. Cusato?

MR. CUSATO: Thank you, Ma'am. Good evening.

MS. OLIVEIRA: Good evening.

MR. CUSATO: So this is like a shell of sort or a crepe?

MS. OLIVEIRA: So let me explain it to you: It comes in a few forms. There's a soft form which was mentioned, which is called a Tripa; and then there's a crispy one, which is called a Bolacha. The Tripa is basically -- they're both used making the same batter. The Tripa is slightly undercooked and that's the consistency of a crepe. So we actually fold it over into a square pocket so you just carry it and go. It's filled with whatever you want inside.

MR. CUSATO: What would you put inside?



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MS. OLIVEIRA: Nutella, you can put Kit Kats, you can put Snickers. We've had people put Snickers and Twix. There's also an egg custard. I tried -- it was a big hit with the S'more's. I have the graham cracker, marshmallow, Hershey Bar all wrapped up in it.

MR. CUSATO: This is like a yogurt place where you pick your fruits, you know, when you go to a yogurt place?

MS. OLIVEIRA: No. We fully make it. It's like a crepe. It's completely closed over and you can walk around with it, so it doesn't require a fork and knife.

So any filling you would normally want in something like this -- a crepe you can get in this, but hopefully we will be a little bit more diverse bringing in some newer combinations.

And then also the other form of it is a crispy form and that's actually folded into a fan-like format. It's very crispy like a Waffle cone that you could eat an ice cream in. If you could think of a large waffle cone folded over with whatever you would like inside which is just melted into the crisp.

MR. PEREIRA: You said it's more like a dessert?

MS. OLIVEIRA: It's a dessert, correct, or

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1	whenever you're feeling hungry.
2	MR. CUSATO: You may have the calories of a
3	meal. Is there anything else like this on Long Island?
4	MS. OLIVEIRA: We're actually the first in all
5	of the United States. So no one has actually tried to
6	bring it out of that small region of Portugal.

MS. OLIVEIRA: My brother actually, being an engineer, is trying to see how we are going to arrange everything and we've been trying to figure that out.

We are going to have basic -- ideally, in the back, maybe one large counter with the machine. But we wanted to have a stand-up along the wall and the top window --

TRUSTEE WALSH: Like a back bar?

MS. OLIVEIRA: Like one of those mini counters as you go behind it with, like, hooks underneath it. We know that we're going to have a lot of commuters, people can hang their bags and kind of have their drink or their treat there, and they kind of just keep going. We want to keep it cozy, not feel like pick it up and go. People do want to wait around a little bit before, you know, leaving the hospital, going to work, shift, changing shift. We want to have that homey feeling. We are going to be having a countertop across the front of the window and a little bit on the side wall.

TRUSTEE WALSH: There's no seats, it's just the counter.

MS. OLIVEIRA: We were going to put bar stool





height benches underneath it. We were going to keep it framed, obviously, the Village Code and based on the square footage that we had. Based on this, it would be about six people.

TRUSTEE WALSH: I had your product at the carnival and the parade also. As a matter of fact, it was a great. There was a lot of people waiting, right?

MS. OLIVEIRA: Yes.

TRUSTEE WALSH: I thought it was a very good product.

I just want to say something along the lines of your success.

I think that that spot is going to be a very good spot because it is what we're looking for with the development of the master plan.

There will be apartment buildings opening up within walking distance of your place. And part of the idea was to have stores like yours and service the people that are going to be living in that small area. So I really think it's a good idea and I wish you success.

MS. OLIVEIRA: Thank you very much.

MAYOR STRAUSS: One question: When are you going to open?

MS. OLIVEIRA: Hopefully, the end of September, but we will certainly be letting you know when that is.

MAYOR STRAUSS: Certainly reach out if it's approved to the Chamber and they have a ribbon cutting ceremony.

MR. CUSATO: Would you serve coffee with this?

MS. OLIVEIRA: Correct. We would be serving -we will be having Espresso. Also cappuccino, the Galao,
which is a Portuguese form of the cappuccino, but it's
more of a latte. It's more milk heavy and less foam as
well.

As far as our beverages go, we wanted to keep some product there, the beverages, to keep them a little bit regional. So Pellegrino, we have Vandavich (phonetic). We also are going to have our own fruit juices, either orange juice and things that are specific to that region in Portugal. We really wanted to give it a little bit of that gourmet feel, something different. I think the whole experience of the store, from the time you come in, from the food, the drinks, and even just the decor itself is going to be a new and very refreshing feel. We're keeping it all coastal, beachy feel inside, and with all of our -- with everything.

MR. CUSATO: If you're going to serve me coffee, would I return that cup to you?

MS. OLIVEIRA: We're going to have to go cups. So the -- same as Starbucks to go cups, but we obvi
